Your letter of August 16th, did not reach me until late Saturday afternoon. I have to-day gone over some material you request in this letter, but it is pretty meagre. You see, I am in the process of producing a book on the Navaho, and while I have material on subjects you list, most of it I cannot release until the book is completed. I have some negatives on an identical subject, but I shall have to make prints to submit to you and I cannot do this for some several days at the earliest, and as you request this material by day after to-morrow, I feel unable to supply you with very much. I have a few 2 1/2 x 3 1/4 color transparencies which I will send to-morrow.

I have not been out on the reservation for two years so that there are many changes. The agricultural training program I want to see. I do have some material on the Fort Wingate vocational school.

I only wish I had heard from you much earlier so that I could have prepared something at least for you. I can only hope that you may find some usable material among the work I shall get in the mail to-morrow.
