Dear Miss Gilpin:

Thank you very much for your order for two yards more of imported Harris Tweed woollens. We acknowledge receipt of your remittance in the amount of \$11.70 in full payment for your order, which has been entered as follows:

2 yards Harris Tweed, pattern No. 515,	
@ \$5.85 per yard	\$11.70

Your order is going forward at once by airmail to our supplier in Great Britain. The cloth should reach us within five or six weeks. As soon as it arrives in Minneapolis, we will clear it through customs and send it on to you by insured parcel post. At that time we will notify you that shipment is being made.

We assume that either you must have some cloth of this pattern left over from the length that you purchased from us about a year ago, or that the jacket which you intend to have made is to be a very short one. Two yards of single width Harris Tweed is not enough for the tailoring of an average suit jacket. The usual requirement is from $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 yards.

If you find that you will require more than the two yard length, please let us know by return airmail. By doing so we will be able to have the total yardage come through in a single piece. If we do not hear from you within a week we will assume that you do not require more than the two yard length.
