I have just been given a modest grant to establish an archive of New Mexico paintings. Knowing that you have photographed many works by Santa Fe artists I thought that I might secure from you photographs for archival purposes. Do you have a list of your negatives of paintings by the prominent artists connected with New Mexico? If you do have such a list and it is not inconvenient, I would like to have an indication of the number of photographs of paintings we could purchase from you.

You may recall that when I last visited you I told you that we were in the process of organizing an exhibition of photography in the Southwest. Such a show would be incomplete without some fine examples of your work. Since we will be publishing a catalog in conjunction with this exhibition I would appreciate it very much if you would answer the following questions:

- 1. When did you first come to New Mexico?
- 2. What attracted you to the area?
- 3. How is the New Mexico landscape, from a photographers standpoint, different from other areas of the West which you have photographed?
- 4. What attracted you to the Indians as a subject for your major works?
