Thank you very much for going over my carbon copy and returning it so promptly. I have made the corrections. re. your question about the Relief Administration and the 100,000 head of sheep, you will find this on page 153 of the 1961 Navaho Year Book. I don't remember where I read that the Council was empowered to issue grazing permits, but I imagine it is somewhere in this same book.

I should have said a farm training program not school, though I am under the impression that the Dept. of Agriculture Agent at Shiprock, did something like this to teach how to improve crops, such as apples, etc. Probably I got this from an exhibit at Shiprock during one of the fairs, but my memory may have been faulty.

One thing I forgot to ask you and you must have not seen the blank space to fill in, is how many rugs and saddle blankets are produced a year now days? Maybe there is no count on this.

I was very disappointed that Mr. Nakai gave me only about three minutes, and did not seem inclined to even open the one volume of my dummy that I took in.
