So Please proceed with the 250 4x5 prints, no border, and of your Exhibition Quality at 85¢ rather than the 80¢ grade you first quoted me. You held the inter-negative and I send the transparency as you may want to check back to it. Please proceed with this order at once.

Order No. 2. internegatives and two 4x5 prints each from two enclosed transparencies of a small dog. These are for a dog fancier. I have indicated cropping on sleeves. The darker one is slightly too yellow, and if you can lighten this one just a little bit. Just go ahead and make these two prints, I am sure they will be O.K.

Dear Mr. Sneff:-

Mrs. Owings has returned the proof and I send it on to you. While she has O.Ked it, I see a slight correction to make if possible. There is a slight greenish tinge which is removed with either a CCO5M or CClOM, and the reds could stand a little strengthening. But it should not produce a pink tone in the sky light. Anything up to that point.

As I am sure you can see, this is a very difficult subject, and the skylight with the brilliant New Mexico light can ordinarily make it much too blue. I waited for the sun to go under a small cloud to get this and the excess blue is gone. This is a suggestion only, and I am sure that your prints will be satisfactory.
