Thank you very much indeed for your letter of the 21st and the kind words you say about my Rio Grande. Of-course I know Paul Horgan and have read his book, but there are things about it I cannot quite forgive, such as errors which could have been so easily checked. The site of Yumke-Yunke is on the north side of the Chama, not on the south etc. there are a number of errors of this type that bother me historically. I think his opening chapter is great. Then he got lost in Texas history, (there was a prize to be won), much of which did not pertain to the Rio. But it is easy to be critical. I have always been most unhappy about the sub title to my book, I had submitted The Rio Grande, River of the Arid Land, but I was told that was to long. I still do not agree.

I shall look forward to seeing your book. When do you expect it to be released? Next week, will, I think see my Enduring Navaho finished. It will be a great relief to have it done.
