Dear Mr. Rochman:-

Just now a package came from the color laboratory containing the color prints which you ordered. The black and white negatives which should have come at least a week ago, have not come, nor are they in this package. I am distressed, for I know your printer's deadline must be here if not already past. However, in this package was the transparency of the Buffalo dancers which you wanted and which should have been returned with the other material. I hasten this off in case it may not yet be too late. And I hope that one of the alternate black and white prints which I sent you last week will have served to replace the turtle dance that you wanted.

I am writing immediately to find out when the negatives were shipped and to run a tracer if possible. Everything I am concerned with seems to have gone haywire. My Navaho book was shipped from here Apr. 11th going to Austin Texas, by Railway Express, and it has not yet been received. I am very anxious about that.

The missing material was marked "rush" and should have come long before this package today. As soon as I can I will mail the color prints (Hamada, etc).

My deep regret over this, but I assure you that the order went off the morning after you were here.
