Dear Mr. Welcher:-

Following our telephone conversation of this morning, I am mailing herewith fourteen negatives together with their corresponding prints for the enlargements. These are over in my workroom and I am in the house, so I will send a copy of list in the next mail. These are all numbered with sizes etc. on both the prints and the negative envelopes.

Mr. Wilder of the Amon Carter Museum in Fort Worth will be here either to-night or tomorrow so I can ask him direct about the method of mounting. I would rather have you do it if this is agreeable with him. However, because of my delay in getting this order in to you, there may not be time to ship the mounted prints as against sending them rolled by air. Can you advise me about this and also the approximate cost of shipping the mounted enlargements?

I will send a check to you to-morrow on account on this order, but I am most anxious to get this in the mail at once.

I hope you wont find these too hard to print. One reason for my delay is that I have been wanting to make some duplicate negatives, that would make your job easier, but I just havent gotten this done.

Please excuse a hurried letter, but I know time is short.
