

Illustrations - For Navajo Weaving.

- * 1. Old Navajo sheep - one or more black sheep with a number of white.
- * 2. Shearing - should show either man or woman shearing - people important in most any slide.
- * 3. Washing wool - perhaps when they have taken sheep to water (or other) should include either people or mesa?
- * 4. Wool drying on bushes.
- x 5. Carding - big pile carded wool and carders.
- x 6. Spinning - 3 spindles full - coarse, medium, fine - might use drawing.
- x 7. Setting up warp - over 4 sticks (or rods)
- x 8. Lashing warp to upper and lower poles.
- x 9. The warp in place on loom.
- x 10. Placing the heddle stick in loom
- x 11. Second heddle stick.
- x 12. The batten in place - first weft thread.
13. Plain or tabby weave (close up to show yarn) or weave - a section of rug
14. Stripes - blanket or rug
15. Tapestry weave - a number of threads hanging.
16. Diamond weave
17. Wedge weave
18. Two Grey Hills - weave and pattern
19. Natural dye rug.
20. Saddle blanket (or double)
21. Woman's manta dress
22. Chief's blanket - both man's and woman's.
23. Dyeing wool or dye plants
24. The loom outdoors. This would come after #6.
25. Wide red belt being woven on V loom.

This is only tentative - will you look it over and then we can discuss it. The ones with an x probably would be from a woman weaving a blanket. It might be difficult to be on hand when the picture could be made.

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
