I shall be glad to make the color photograph for you. This will require some hunting for a right location, finding Indians who will cooperate etc. However, as I have friends in several of the neighboring Pueblos, I am sure I can find good models. The sample color reproduction you sent me is excellent, I only wish we had as good in this country, but the Swiss are noted for this work.

I assume that 4x5 color transparency is what you wish. I can work smaller or larger, but 4x5 is perhaps the most used size for advertising work. The price would be around \$200 depending on time and fee etc.

If you still wish me to do this, I would appreciate as full specifications as possible. An Indian woman in Indian costume, I presume you would want.

I am glad you saw the Navaho exhibit at the Riverside Museum. They only showed half of it. It was shipped to Oklahoma City on Sept. 6th and is lost in transit. Seems incredible, but the Air Freight Co. has told me to file my claim. It took me over a year to prepare that show.

Perhaps I could also do a New Mexico Ranch shot, or something in the mountains. We have a very great variety of landscape out here.
