New Construction, every thing torn up, open basements full of all sorts of crates, boxes, luggage, and far too few police to protect all this open to the sky. So anything could have happened.

This Museum is in the old Air Port Bldg. so it is right next door to the new Air Port. That crate, now that I know the dimensions contains the photo murals (the least valuable) but put a declared value of \$750. on it. The Museum will call me when the crate arrives and I can go down and pick it up in my station wagon.
