SPECIAL BALLOT - AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

(Please return to Headquarters Office, 1619 New Hampshire Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C. 20009, by July 30, 1970.)

TO ACTIVE MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY:

(1) On December 3, 1969, a Ballot was sent to Active members of the Society to amend the Constitution by adding the word "Secretary" (Article IV, Section 1) to the list of officers and the changing of "thirteen" to "fourteen" Council members (Article V, Section 1). This ballot was voted upon favorably.

At that time it was overlooked that Article VII, Elections, Section 1, also needed changing from "thirteen" to "fourteen" members for the National Executive Council. Does this change meet with your approval? If so, please vote below and return this ballot.

(2) It has been proposed that Article III, Section 1 (b) Membership, be amended to permit Corresponding members of the Society to transfer to Active membership. This article now reads: "Those eligible for Corresponding membership shall be women who fulfill the requirements for Active membership but who reside outside of the United States and Canada." It is proposed to add the following sentence. "Corresponding members who wish to belong to an organized Group and receive notices may request Active member status."
