I am sorry to be so long in answering your letter, but my old and dear friend Miss Forster, whom I am sure I told you about (she was the nurse who worked on the Reservation) died on New Year's day, and I am just getting back to taking care of my mail.

I hope you didn't misunderstand me over the telephone about the string game things. I have known about these for many years and have always wanted an opportunity to photograph it. What little I did at Crownpoint that day was most unsatisfactory to me; first because the children were too dressed up, and second because no one seemed to know what to do.

What I was referring to was that I hope to get over to the Reservation again soon on a new project of my own and that possibly I can incorporate just a touch of this. I think it would be very difficult to illustrate a monograph. I am sure that Editha Watson could do a good job on this if she is able and perhaps I can see her, but to do a whole series of pictures would mean quite a lot of work and more information than I now have. I can also talk to another Navaho woman I know who might be interested in doing the whole thing with any pictures that she could arrange for me. So, I think it would be better for me to just leave it as it is for the time being.

I am so sorry that you have had to give up your job at Thoreau and I hope that you are doing well at home in Idaho. This brings my best wishes to you and good luck on whatever you are undertaking at the moment.
