Dear Fellow Member:

Despite the significant logistic and economic reasons for shifting to a less-frequent Bulletin, it was felt that the Bulletin provides an all-important link among the members, and this should not be broken until such time as something better is devised.

So - may we again have your questionnaire. The 1974 Bulletin is to be produced by a team effort in Washington, because I'm here in New Mexico on a six-month assignment and will be returning to Washington only in time to pull the various components of the Bulletin together. Will you send your responses to Headquarters by August 1st; late arrivals will be processed only if time permits.

Please put your responses to Item 8 in narrative form; it greatly expedites the processing of each questionnaire to be able to insert the paragraph directly into the Bulletin manuscript. However, please keep the paragraph short and include only those activities which will interest the membership as a whole.

We appreciate the continued receipt of your new publications and the glossy-print photographs of you in action. However, in reviewing the files of the membership in preparation for the 50th Anniversary celebration, I noted that the clippings from newspapers, journals, reviews, etc. relative to special activities of our members seem fewer in number than formerly. Would you send along such clippings, both on yourself and on fellow members. They help to round out our files.

Many thanks for the fine response we had to the special questionnaire on the Bulletin that went to you last year. They were most helpful in evaluating the usefulness of the Bulletin and will doubtless serve as a guide in setting the course of the Society in our 2nd half century.

Each Group president was recently sent, for distribution to the members, copies of a new brochure recently issued by the Society. The brochure was designed to answer many of the inquiries about the Society which are received in Headquarters each year, to assist in publicizing the Fellowship programs, and to provide members with a compact statement about the aims of the Society and its membership. Additional copies can be secured from Headquarters.
