Dear Ms. Noggle:

Elaine King, photography editor of <u>Midwest Art</u>, suggested I contact you. I would like to develop an exhibit of photographs of American Indians by American Indians. I want the exhibit to express the Indian viewpoint: on his heritage, his interaction with white society and his hopes for the future. I am not concerned with what statements the photographers make about Indian life, only that these statements be made artistically.

Exchange National Bank of Chicago is the only for-profit institution in the United States exclusively collecting fine photography. Our Permanent Collection of Photography enjoys an international reputation. In addition, the bank originates two special photography exhibits each year.
