Enclosed is a fresh business card, and I have also sent a slightly-out-of-date print listing to give you some sort of feel for my gallery.

It's unfortunate the exhibition schedule for your W.A.A.M. show is nearly over. I have a hole to fill in my schedule of November 1 to December 10. If this show, or a smaller version of it, is not entirely out of the question, I would certainly be glad to handle the costs of shipping and insurance, etc. (if it is not astronomical). Otherwise, perhaps a show of some 40 prints in the fall of 1978 would be possible. I mention next year because I know you are burdened with a lot of work now, and I don't want to load you up any further.

In a few months, however, I will probably place an order for some prints. I understand the retail prices are as follows (with a gallery discount of 40 percent):

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
PRINT LISTING: December, 1976

The Afterimage is an art gallery devoted exclusively to photography. It has been opened since October, 1971. The gallery also sells in-print fine photographic books.

The Afterimage is a direct agent for most of the photographers listed below. Some, however, are supplied to us from other dealers. We can frequently obtain through other dealers particular photographs by artists not listed. At this time we do not publish an illustrated catalogue. Published illustrated references or copy prints can be supplied, and material can be mailed on approval.

- Ansel Adams (1902--), lives in Carmel, California. Although Mr. Adams stopped taking further print orders from galleries and individuals December 31, 1975, we still have a number of images available. Prices range from \$800.00 to \$1,200.00 (for Moonrise, Hernandez). We also have a few copies left of the limited-edition version (1,000) of Ansel Adams Images 1923-1974. This book comes with a signed photograph printed by Ansel Adams and sells for \$325.00.
- Eugene Atget (1857-1927), French. We have a small selection of images printed by Berenice Abbott. Prices average around \$350.00.
- George N. Barnard (1819-1902), American. We have a few images from
 Photographic Views of the Sherman Campaign with prices ranging from
 \$550.00 to \$800.00.
- David Bayles (1948--), lives in Eugene, Oregon. Prices range from \$60.00 to \$100.00. Mr. Bayles is a young photographer who works in the view camera tradition. He is having more and more exhibits around the country.
- Gary Bodenhausen (1944--), lives in Kansas City, Missouri. He is a professor of photography at the Kansas City Art Institute. Price is \$85.00 a print.
- Hugo Brehme. He was a German photographer who spent much of his life in Mexico. We have one rare print taken during the 1920s, <u>Villa de Guadalupe</u>, \$350.00.
- John Bullock (1854-1939), American. Sailing Away, c. 1900, platinum print, \$350.00.
- Julia Margaret Cameron (1815-1879), English. Portrait of May Pincep, 1870, excellent condition, \$1,200.00.
- Paul Caponigro (1932--), lives in Santa Fe, New Mexico. Most any image available, \$350.00 up to 16 x 20, \$400.00 for 16 x 20.

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- Edward S. Curtis (1868-1952), American. We have a few large-format photogravures, \$200.00 a print.

- Frank Eugene (1865-1936), American. Nude--A Study, from Camera Work, volume 31, published July, 1910, \$250.00.
- Walker Evans (1904-1975), American. We have 23 vintage prints, priced around \$900.00 each. We also have the Ives-Sillman Portfolio (#84) of 14 prints, \$8,000.00.
- Roger Fenton (1819-1869), English. On the Wharfe, Bolton Bridge, 1858, \$300.00.
- Francis Frith (1822-1899), English. A small selection of prints priced around \$60.00 each.
- Lewis W. Hine (1874-1940), American. We have a group of 85 prints made around the state of Texas in 1913, average price \$200.00 each.
- Joseph Jachna (1935--), lives in Cak Lawn, Illinois. Most any image available from this photographer who produces unusual contemporary prints, \$75.00 each.
- B. A. King, lives in Southboro, Massachusettes. He specializes in small, black-and-white New England scenes, \$55.00 a print.
