She recently (last fall) went to another museum for several days and without warning was subjected to interviews and video-taping. When she returned here she decided she would go to no other museums since she was so tired for several weeks after that strenuous occasion. She has been assured that her presence at the Cowboy Hall of Fame is all that will be asked of her and anything else will be strictly voluntary on her part. Under these conditions, she has agreed to go. I am sure you understand Miss Gilpin's situation. Her health and comfort are foremost to us all, and your co-operation is greatly appreciated. Perhaps at a later time, when her health is better, something can be arranged. Thankyou again for your help and your interest is Miss Gilpin and her work.
