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LIVES IN PHOTOGRAPHY

Do you like the title? It sounds right to everyone so far.

This bulletin is just to keep you posted on the progress of the book — and the exhibition. Please forgive the Xerox.

I was in New York for a week (13-17th of March) and tried to be in touch with all of you who live in the area called the Northeast! I made considerable headway in the research and selection of photographs while I was there.

I have a tentative list for selection of the thirty photographs which will be edited to twenty for the exhibit and fifteen for the book. (Please don't forget that I will need a few photographs of you from early-middle periods of your career.) The exhibition space provides for cases also, which means that we can gather any interesting materials like magazines,

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cameras, diaries, books now out of print, portfolios, etc. This will greatly enrich the texture of the show.

Cornell Capa and his director of exhibitions, William Swing, at GCP are very excited about having the exhibition which they consider a major show. The schedule is (Sept - Oct 1979)

Enclosed is a list of titles for the exhibition/book. Kindly check them for correction and see if you like the group. There is plenty of room for change. If you can provide dates wherever possible, I would be grateful. (You can put c.1950 and give the general idea. It's up to you.) Please keep in mind that we want an early photo (if not the earliest) and a few recent examples if you can provide them. If you are not currently photographing then consider "recent" broadly!

I hope to have all the photographs gathered by September of this year. They will be

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carefully stored at Viking-Penguin until production on the book and then until selection for exhibition. I will see that they get to the museum from the publisher and that the remaining prints are returned to you.

Under the terms of the National Endowment for the Arts grant which TCP is applying for to support the major aspects of the exhibition - each photographer will receive \$750 loan fee for use of the prints in the exhibition. (I hope to raise money above that amount.) The photographs will travel in their frames for two years and ought to return to you in the same condition as before.

I am extremely grateful for your cooperation on all these tedious details. We are trying to allow sufficient time to work things into your already full lives - I hope things are clear and simple. If you need me to help in any way, from printing to boxing to talking - just call collect 415-655-4920
