I am writing this note to confirm our discussion on the phone this afternoon about the misplaced photograph TYING THE CHONGO, which is being used in the forthcoming book and show RECOLLECTIONS: TEN WOMEN OF PHOTOGRAPHY. As I explained to you the print was lost (I hope only temporarily) in the confusion of getting them back from the printer, sending them to the free lance designer for the INTERNATIONAL CENTER OF PHOTOGRAPHY for her to make the postcards, and her sending them back to Viking Press for the book. ICP and Viking share the blame for this mishap and we would be happy to reimburse you for the cost of making a new print to be hung in the ICP show in September. Fortunately, the duotone separations for the have already been made. Naturally, it would be wonderful if I could have a print to compare to the reproduction while we are on press with the book (which will be the week of August 20th), but I realize that this is very short notice.

On a happier note, I have spoken to Dr. Ron Tyler at the Amon Carter Museum and I was so glad to hear of his enthusiasm for the retrospective monograph of your work. We are talking to printers and preparing estimates at this time, and I will be in touch with you and your lawyer Jerry Richardson with a more definite proposal very soon.
