HOPI--19th CENTURY

Tablita--a ceremonial headgear
of the Pueblo Indians of the
Southwest.

The shapes and designs are made
in the image of Pueblo desire--
rain, clouds, sun, corn, blossom,
rainbow.....

This Butterfly Maiden Tablita
utilizes symbols of stepped clouds,
rainbow, rain.

Tablitas, in essence, carry a
similar type of information for
the Puebloans to that characterized
by a Bishop's Miter for those of
the Christian Faith.
