Dear Mr. Wardlaw:-

Your letter of Feb. 3rd. came several days ago and I have waited to answer it until I had heard from Dr. Eisenbeiss in Phoenix.

First, though I understand all the problems, it is still a great disappointment to have the book postponed for a whole year. I guess I have been spoiled by the promptness with which my other books were put into production. But the fact that there is such a flood of books with such good sales is at least a most encouraging thought.

I have just heard from this doctor. It has been difficult to get an appointment with him. He wants me in Phoenix on March first. I am wondering if you and Mitch could come the week end before? I have no idea at this point how long I will be over there so it is difficult to set a time after March 1st, though as soon as I get a diagnosis I could let you know at once what my plans will have to be.

At this point it seems to me advisable for the three of us to go over all my alternate material including my color slides. We could run through the latter in perhaps a half hour. These are standard size slides which I have used in a lecture on the Navaho. We might want to change one or two color subjects, or I can always make black & white prints from them. Mitch has not seen all of these, and though he is not planning to use any color in the exhibition, still this might open up some new ideas.

I had hoped that I would have gone to Phoenix and come home before you came up. That may still be the case unless it is convenient for you to come by approximately the 25th of February.
