Dear Mrs. Morris:-

It was nice indeed to receive your letter more than a month ago. I did not think I would be so long in answering it. It was good to hear news of the Stolworthys and to learn of your relation to them. The picture in the post with Troy Kennedy, I made on July 2, 1952. I do not remember that your father was there that day. For once I dated that negative even to the day. It is certainly a coincidence that we meet by letter so far removed from Red Rock. I am afraid your father has me confused with someone else. I never was a teacher. My friend Elizabeth Forster was the nurse at Red Rock in 1931-33, and I went down to visit her a number of times. Then we were back for visits several times in later years.

I was very pleased with the last completed proof that came in on the book and I am looking forward to a fine job of printing.

Mr. Rice was here a day or two ago and I gave him some added names to see on his New Mexico travels. I hope he does well.

I have been hoping to receive the announcements that I understand you are preparing on the book. I have quite a list to whom I want to send them and want to add a short personal note. These will go mostly to people in the East, West coast, and Europe and I may turn this list over to Lucile Webb and let her send them out as I am up to my neck still on exhibitions. She is after me for this list and I told her yesterday, I would write to find out how soon we can expect these announcements.

I assume that I will get the usual ten free copies. My indebtedness is very great on this book and I shall need at least fifteen additional copies, twenty five in all. I trust that I get these at wholesale price

and I trust also that these can be charged to my account. My whole summer has been spent working on exhibitions and haven't stopped to earn anything. I trust that I will get caught up one of these days. Also if I may have six or eight of the fall catalogue, I would like to send them to a number of people connected with museums around the country. As all museums now seem to have sales desk, I hope I can do some good in this direction.

With the best of wishes, and I hope that we can know the publication date pretty soon. This is another request from Mrs. Webb.
