Laura Gilpin's book on the Navaho Indians will be published in October or November of 1968. The job of copy editing has almost been completed.

Miss Gilpin furnished us with a complete dummy of the book including both text and pictures, although the prints of the pictures are not what she considers reproduction quality. As soon as the editor has finished with it I will send these dummies to you. They will give you a quick picture of what the entire book is like. The text that the editor is working with has been changed in some respects from that which is bound in the dummies but not enough so that you will be prevented from getting an accurate picture.

There will be twenty-one color plates in the book, but not all of these are represented in the dummy by prints.

I know you have to work rather far ahead on these pictorial articles and our publication date may be too soon to permit you to schedule a piece based on our book. However, if you decide to go ahead with it, we will be happy to cooperate in any way that we can. I am sure that Miss Gilpin can provide prints of any pictures you want to use.

I really would be delighted if you could do a piece on Miss Gilpin's book. It is one of the most beautiful books that we have had the privilege of publishing and everybody here has fallen quite in love with it.
