Dear Miss Gilpin:

Thank you for your letter of July 22 and the Index for The Enduring Navaho, both of which arrived at the Press last Thursday.

You and your helpers certainly were thorough, and your Index shows the result of much hard work. I have finished editing the Index and have given it to the designer for marking and transmission to the typesetter. In editing the Index, I shortened some modifications, combined some entries, added page numbers to some modifications, and added some new entries.

We have made the typ^e corrections that you indicated in your letter, with two exceptions. The forms "De Chelly" and "Del Muerto" are correct when "Canyon" is omitted. Also, the phrase "volcanic cone" is correct, and should not be "volcanic core."

The phrase "picture of" has been added in the Index for all people and most places that are named in the captions, except for those in the color plates, which are not on numbered pages.

One question has come up--the caption for your original Plate 35 reads "Old Lady Grey Salt," while in the text and in several other captions the woman is called "Old Lady Long Salt." Which is correct?

One of the members of our staff, the daughter of an Indian trader, was reading some of your book, with great enjoyment, by the way. She said, however, that "the late Carlos Stohlworthy" mentioned in the Acknowledgments is not dead and that the name is spelled "Stolworthy." We have made this change. I do hope that the other "lates" really are.
