

By the terms of that treaty, the Navaho agreed to live peacefully with their Indian, Spanish & Mexican neighbors - a promise which has remained unbroken. In return the US Gov. promised that they might return to their old land - and that they would receive sheep & seed grain for a new start. Also the Navaho were promised one teacher for every 30 children - a promise which to this day has not been fulfilled.

We flew directly over ^{apart of} the route of the Long Walk & one could picture the march of the 6000 Navaho & their Captors ~~and~~ as they slowly left their homeland.

To the right I looked out across the reservation being able at this altitude to see the northern boundary.

Sheep were siloed up - more sheep than there are in this high distance and beyond the snowy summits of Debutson - (The LaPlata range) the Navaho Sacred Mt. of the North.

We came quickly back to Santa Fe - landing in the late afternoon. It was a memorable day - It seemed incredible that in the course of one day, I could have seen so closely & so clearly - the entire 25,000 square miles of the ~~Navaho~~ Reservation.
