It looks as though I may be coming over in a week of two. I still have some holes to fill in. I do not have enough information on the council, nor the judiciary, and I need more knowledge of Chee Dodge. Otherwise I am just about finished. You will probably be at Fort Defiance by the time I come over so I will see you. This will be very nice. I am afraid, however, that Miss Forster will not be coming. She is getting very frail.

I also want to see Martin Link at the Museum, Samm* Day, Shirley Sells, and Annie Wauneka so I shall probably be around for several days.

There is a Navaho girl whom I am very interested in, who comes from near Fluted Rock. Alberta Nofchissy. She was a student here at the Institute of American Indian Art. A ~~6666~~ talented girl. She married last year just at the end of school a boy from Montana, I forget the tribe, and I am not she if she is in Montana or at Fluted Rock. If she is on the reservation I do want to find her when I come over. A very fine painter, and then she started weaving, on a horizontal loom and was doing wonderful things.

I am getting very impatient now to finish the book and get it under way. But I must get all these last details right.
