The tregedy of the hairpin being dropped on one of the YUCATAN plates sounds almost too much. Manufacturing is bad enough without this kind of trouble. The story doesn't seem to be quite right though, because what would a woman be doing working over a sheet fed gravure plate, as that is the only thing I can connect the hairpin with.

The question of any replacements is still open as the book is only in its beginning stages.

Do let me know if anything comes out of the Guggenheim judging. I do hope for your sake that it will work.
