CORRECTIONS FOR SECOND EDITION OF RIO GRANDE.

- Page 8. raise type body. Include type from page 9.
- Page 9. move type body to page 8
- Page 10. move two lines from page 10 to page 8
- Page 10. balance of type to go page 9.
- Page 11. first pp. to go page 9. ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~
- Page 10 move 2nd pp. from page 11 to page 10, low position
- Page 11. last pp. to stay as is.
- Page 124. Error on page proofs was found too late to reset type. Can the change be made now? In the first line delete the words "which was" so that text will read --" Santa Fe, capital of Nuevo Mexico, the Territory of New Mexico etc."
- Page 132 Bottom pp. belongs on page 133. Drop first pp to low position and move 2nd pp. to page 133.
- Page 133. Leave "Drought takes its toll***" as is. Then space. Then pp. how on page 132 "Below San Felipe***"
Follow with pp "Francisco Vasquez Coronado and text body along as it fills pages to page 136. There is room for this, it will simply shorten space on page 136 as two more lines are moved along from preceding pages. If this is not clear, will write it all out. The error is that the Coronado story is broken by the insertion of line and $\frac{1}{2}$ caption on page 133. Coronado story should begin after this, not on page 132 as it now stands.

The above errors in paging are mine. I just did not catch them on the page proofs.

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When I left New York the plan for pages 236 and 237 were very definite. Had I been notified that the text material for the APPENDIX would require more space than estimated, I would have deleted the half-title page at once. It kills the scale of the final picture beside being on the important right hand page.

Please change as follows:-

Page 236. Text body as is. Move picture and quote to p. 237

Page 237 Place picture same position as it now is but on 236.

Page 237. Either delete half-title page completely or move it to page 238.

Page 239. Insert in proper date sequence in right hand column

"1746 Establishment of Escandon settlements along lower Rio Grande."

The following pages have a most unfortunate blemish. Is it damaged rollers? I know that these plates were perfect when they left the engravers. A spot from some source is on each of the following pages.
