Dear Cap:-

Since my letter to you of March 14, I have made a thorough search for missing Royalty statements and have come up with four more including the one marked "missing" on that statement. I enclose a revised Statement. I also made an error in addition. But also I have found a letter from Charles dated Aug. 4, 1954 giving the total number of books received by you. The first printing totals 4490, the second 3150. Sales through June of 1954 totaled 6427 including the 1000 copies overstocked. Another letter of March 12th of 1954 stated that there were "over a thousand copies still in stock". So somewhere, somehow there are still 1173 copies unaccounted for.

Also I find a letter dated August 26, 1958, which says that you had the plates at that time. I knew that the type had been distributed. So what has happened to the plates between Aug. 1958 and now?

I assume that you have awaited Charles' return to go over our account. And I trust that final accounting will agree with mine. Unless you still have copies on hand, there are quite a number unaccounted for.
