Dear Walter:-

The trip to Colorado Springs was very nice and the tea a success. Mrs. Hanschuet sold more than twenty five copies that afternoon which seems excellent for a small place. But I don't count it for my friends were being very loyal. It will be the places where I am not known that count, of-course. I am wondering if the book is in use at yet and how soon we can expect to hear from the outlook down there. But to go back to Colorado Springs. Joan Charlot, artist, who copied all the frescoes found in the Temple of the Warriors and who collaborated in the Carnegie report, is now teaching at the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center. He came to the tea and was very enthusiastic about the book. said he wanted to review it for the American Magazine of Art and could he have a reviewer's copy? I would have given him one on the spot, but the additional order the book shop had sent for, did not come in until the next day, and she was very short for the tea. I had taken up some of my own, just in case, which filled out, but did not fill all orders. Would you send Mr Charlot a copy, or if you ~~would~~ send no one, I will autograph it for him. I am short here, too, as my second order has not yet come. That review would be very valuable and I appreciate his wanting to do it.

One other matter I have intended in asking you about, is a small "erratum" slip, for the error on page 42. it is not your error as I have already told you. My copyist is to blame, but the real blame is on me, for I should have caught it first before I sent it to you, and twice again on proofs. How easy it is to have something get by.
