I was under the impression that the South-western Monuments Association, at least several of it's custodians, did handle the PUEBLOS, and that we did a fair amount of business with them. I am turning over a copy of this letter to Miss Dwyer to check.

We have written to Mr. Hall, and return herewith his letter. Many thanks. The six copies are also being sent to you under separate cover.

You mention the public school system. We have found that we are able to get supplementary readers in some of the public schools where we are able to discover the names of the people in charge. Perhaps you could help us for this in the Southwest. We would be glad to follow up from there.

I had meant to write previously concerning the postcard situation, but can't remember at this time whether I did so. In any event, I have checked very carefully and find that, unfortunately, it would be much too difficult and too expensive a distribution and manufacturing problem at this time to do it, and we, therefore, have to reluctantly forget about it for the present.
