I hope that there will not be any corrections and that we can have them back soon for we are still working against time. I thought that we had the production problems licked as far as schedules are concerned, but there're still quite bad.

I'm sorry about the calendar wheel, but when I wrote you previously, I referred to the receipt of the hieroglyph chart which somehow I had confused with the wheel.

We most certainly will get in touch with Dr. Morley to see if he will review the book. In fact I should like to make some kind of a deal with the University of Stanford to perhaps sell our book to its own mailing list.

Our agents in Latin America do not know Barbachano in Yucatan. You didn't mention whether this was a bookstore or any other type of outlet, and which city it was in. I know that our salesmen would be delighted to make any worthwhile contact. The American Bookstore is, of course, one of our customers.
