Am home, but the doctor doesn't want me to do much until December 11, when he will remove the drainage tube, close the vent and take out the stitches. I have a lot of sedation, but aside from the pain, feel better and stronger each day. I stayed in bed from yesterday afternoon until 4:30 this morning, woke up filled with thanksgiving, got up and dictated some work, and then made up a batch of oatmeal bread for this evening, so it is in here now, rising and smelling up the cold studio splendidly.

What a joy to be home again, to be with the family, and to have the delight of Amanda.

The doctors are very pleased with this surgery. It is splendid, apparently.
