session with René, in which event I'll send
a P.S. I have never felt such a total lack of
confidence in myself, and I am grateful to
you for bearing with me.

* However, if you feel intimacy of subject
speaks best in 8×10 -ish guise, this is a
consideration, too. Callahan, for instance,
always favors this format, which speaks
softly of his thoughts. Robert Frank usually
makes his 11×14 -ish, and Dorothea's are
compact. Mr. Steichen's are 14×17 , very often.
It is hard to be fast and rigid about this, as the

subject usually speaks its
mind, and this controls
best-favorites. Bruce Davidson, by choice, uses 8×10 also.
