Not the least of which is the Scrimshaw Press. I hope that you will have seen our new book, Roger Minick's Delta West, by the time you receive this letter. We are terribly proud. We have hand-delivered it to several San Francisco bookstores for a pre-Christmas offering and the reception has been tremendous. It's official publication date is January 29 and I think that it will quickly sell out. Greta's book goes very well, too. It's a word-of-mouth affair, perhaps a bit like Mother and Child in that respect. Everyone who buys one buys another for a friend. We were delighted to see your influence at work in an order from the Hickory Stick. It's nice to be small enough that one can notice that sort of thing.

In the absence of sufficient capital, it's difficult to talk about future projects, but we have every intention of continuing (under a new name--have you any suggestions?) Ansel Adams has shown signs of interest in letting us do a portfolio of some of his previously unpublished photographs and that is the sort of project for which Edwin Land might be willing to lend a financial hand. I know that we are competent and that we will find help when the need arises. And wouldn't a new edition of <u>Mother and Child</u> be wonderful!

There are many other good projects in the air, but my message is a simple one-the Mitchells are well in body and spirit and forever grateful to you for your loving care and understanding. Our lives are, in good measure, a dedication to you.
