Greta and I will go to London and Frankfurt next month, to attend the great Frankfurt book fair, and we'll do all we can to interest a European publisher in buying the book for his own list. It may also be time to discuss a soft cover version tho' Scrimshaw is rather short of cash these days to be planning any new forays.

A very poignant scene: a lady slowly climbed our long flight of stairs. She was a few weeks away from delivering a child and she was coming to buy a copy of MOTHER AND CHILD for herself, as a pre-partum gift. I was only sorry that there was nobody to give her a copy at the moment. Ironically enough, she's a very fine local photographer.
