Greetings!

I am excited to be able to tell you that the interest in Recollections grows as the exhibition travels. Several of the photographers have already been asked to show works in other exhibitions, to sell photographs or to publish their work. This is the real reward for Recollections! I am so pleased for you! Please let me know what is happening and I will spread the word to the others. I feel that I owe you an endless supply of communication and also pictures (I will gladly make copies of any and all pictures).

The main way I can show my appreciation for your participation in Recollections is to carry out the plan for permanent housing of the exhibition as I discussed it during the last two years. As each of you know I am going to ask a major archive or museum to obtain funds to purchase (on a grant) the exhibition in its entirety to form a collection which will be invaluable to historical aesthetic study. It is for this reason that I obtained photographs from the photographer herself whenever possible and did not ask institutions for works on loan.

I am hoping to offer each photographer \$8,000 for the collection. This is a median figure which reflects a high price for some and an average price for others. It is based on your loan agreement forms with ICP. Naturally it is rather pleasant to sell all those prints at once and also to have twenty of your works in an institution where they can be studied as a unit no matter where you choose to leave your entire collection. Often if an artist's work is left all in one archive it disappears. This way, Recollections provides another place for students of photography to study originals of your life work. I think it is worthwhile effort and a fair price. What do you think?
