

Memorandum: THE BARE FEET, by Nell Dorr

Agreement between the New York Graphic Society as publishers and Mrs. Nell Dorr,  
author and producer.


Following our various discussions and the period of planning in the preparation of the book, THE BARE FEET, the New York Graphic Society is prepared to work with Mrs. Dorr in the publication of this book in the following way:

- I. New York Graphic Society will undertake to perform all the necessary functions of publisher of the American edition. This involves distribution of the book to the trade. We shall take the book into our own list in exactly the same way as any other New York Graphic Society publication, giving it the necessary promotion and publicity, listing it in our catalog, and sending out the proper amount of review copies.
- II. New York Graphic Society will store the book, in a number later to be agreed upon, it will ship the book, and invoice at the list price less the necessary discounts.
- III. Mrs. Dorr will act as the producer as well as the author of THE BARE FEET. She will make all the necessary arrangements with the printer, designer, and other suppliers, for its manufacture. She will assume complete financial responsibility for the cost of production and delivery of books to the New York Graphic Society.
- IV. Mrs. Dorr will act as agent for the book in any other market outside the United States and will make any arrangement she feels necessary to place the rights for THE BARE FEET with publishers in other countries.
- V. New York Graphic Society and Mrs. Dorr will agree upon a world list price, this to be determined by eventual costs of manufacture plus our mutual best opinion as to the market.
- VI. It is the intention of both Mrs. Dorr and New York Graphic Society that the book be ready for distribution for fall, 1961.

- VII. The New York Graphic Society, in return for its efforts and activities as the U.S. publisher of THE BARE FEET, will arrange with Mrs. Dorr for a necessary remuneration after the basic cost price and list price of the book can be established. This figure will be based upon normal cost of operation of New York Graphic Society.
- VIII. Mrs. Dorr at all times may consult with New York Graphic Society on any matter in connection with the production of the book.
- IX. In order to protect Mrs. Dorr it is suggested that the book bear the following legend in the appropriate place: "No part of this book, including any of the illustrations, may be reproduced without the written permission of the New York Graphic Society, to whom all applications so to do should be addressed."
