Information Agency has requested the Foundation for 150 copies to distribute in libraries all over the world and has been further promised by the Foundation additional copies up to 1,000 if they should be requested.

The comments on the book enclosed with it will show you the powerful effect it has had on a large number of people and for that reason we would appreciate anything you can do to add to its circulation.
