Dear Mr. Dorr:

I have been holding your letter of September 22 to see whether I was right in thinking that you were going to send me a copy of Mrs. Dorr's book. However, my time is getting short as I am leaving for Pakistan on Thursday. We should certainly get the book one way or another, but I will not be able to do anything about it until my return in November. The book sounds terrific. I am not quite sure from the references just what it is about.

I assure you that it would be entirely consistent with any obligations I have in any direction to show the book to anybody I wanted to and to get reactions on it.
