I wonder if you recall sitting next to me when Winthrop Churchill talked at M. I. T. several years ago.

Finding Bob in Venezuela, however, I am writing you directly and sending the book under separate cover, together with a small reprint that tells the story of Mrs. Dorr's photographic background.
