Dear Mr. Scripps:

It was a great pleasure to meet you the other day. It has occurred to me that you might be interested in perhaps the smallest foundation in the country and I am, therefore, taking pleasure in sending you the only report we have ever published, as well as a copy of my wife's book referred to in it.

It is possible that I shall be in Cincinnati on some other matters within a short time, and, if so, I will give myself the pleasure of calling up to see if you are in town.

Referring to the factory proposition suggested to me by Mr. Hanspal, the Sikh, who came to me, I have advised him that the World Population Emergency Campaign as such is occupied in raising money for the present and would not be interested in attempting to help this practical demonstration of its purpose.

The only chance that I see to contribute would be through an assistant who is connected with a group in which I am interested called TEAM, and who could put together such information as might justify any individual in wanting to back this up on the basis of eventually getting money back and leaving all profits to be utilized in India for carrying on our aims.

If you have any thoughts as an individual regarding this, I would be glad to have you write me.
