

# RULES

## READ BEFORE FILLING OUT BLANK

The sire and dam of the lambs you wish to record must be recorded in The American Shropshire Registry Association.

All sheep MUST wear a metallic label in the ear, numbered and bearing the breeder's, owner's or applicant's initials thereon. No number shall be duplicated.

**Ear Tags:**

**Breeder:** The breeder of an animal is the party owning the dam at the time of service.

Each application blank must be signed only by the breeder and applicant of the sheep whose pedigrees are given on the blank. No blank may bear the name of more than one breeder or applicant.

**Record of Dam:**

No pedigree of any Shropshire shall be accepted for registry unless records show name of owner of dam at time of service to be same as that of person signing entry blank as breeder.

**Bred Ewes:**

A ewe having changed ownership before it is recorded and having been bred before sale is made must have name of owner at time of service inserted in space indicated for such information on the face of this blank.

**Twins:**

The pedigree of each twin to be recorded must be written on a separate line.

In referring to sheep always give both its name and association number.

**Fees:**

Remit fees in full with all applications as required by amendment Rule 8. DO NOT REMIT CHECKS ON LOCAL BANKS, CANADIAN CURRENCY NOR POSTAGE STAMPS.

Application for American bred, if made before December 31st of year succeeding birth, 50 cents to members. Non-members, \$1.00. Double fees will be charged for all sheep entered later than time limit named.

**Imported Sheep:**

Applications for imported sheep must be written on entry "Form E." Lambs imported in dams are considered imported sheep.
