Dear Mr. Dealey,

You will perhaps think that I have forgotten my promise to send you a picture of some of the old-timers in this section of the country, which was taken at the J. A. Ranch some months ago. Mr. Hobart, however, has been away and I have only just secured a copy from him, which I am forwarding to-day under separate cover. Reading from left to right the names are as follows:- Top Row: M. K. Brown, Whitfield Carhart, T. D. Hobart, Henry Taylor, J. W. Kent, W. H. Patrick and George Dunn. Bottom Row: Vas Stickley, T. S. Bugbee, Chas. Goodnight, Capt. G. W. Arrington and Judge O. H. Nelson.

Mr. Goodnight came here in the early '60's as a scout for the State Rangers. Capt. Arrington came in 1878 and was a Captain in the State Rangers; he now lives at Canadian. Mr. T. S. Bugbee of Clarendon came in 1876 or 1877. Mr. Stickley of Canadian in 1878. Mr. Dunn of Mobeetie came in the early '90's. Mr. Patrick of Clarendon in 1887 or 1888. Mr. Henry Taylor of Clarendon came in the early '80's, and was formerly an assistant of Mr. Goodnight's. Mr. J. W. Kent of Clarendon came in 1883 and has been for many years superintendent of the J. A. Ranch. Mr. Hobart came to Texas in 1886, had charge of the White Deer lands for some 20 years, and was also General Manager of the J. A. Ranch, and is now joint executor
