I'm not ready yet to recommend the shape and scope of the new group, though we do have some important friends who have agreed to lend their names to our effort. Among them are Faul Ehrlich, Justice Douglas, George Wald, and Joseph Wood Krutch. My farewell speech suggests a direction for the group and I wish you would think hard and speak up. Right away we will need funding. I have been talking with two foundations and see some firm help in due course, but we must not await perfection. It is important to know what you can think and do now.

The naming of a new organization is critically important. Use of the name--and hopes--of John Muir (from Scotland, Wisconsin, the Gulf, Sierra, and Alaske, with a universal genius too) would probably be appropriate. Meanwhile, I would urge you to stay with the Sierra Club and with the ABC Committee. There is a great deal to be gained by recouping our losses next year, and it will take a lot of hard work. CMC has indicated that it will stay in existence, and they will be working very hard to unseat Martin Litton, Fat Goldsworthy, and Eliot Forter next year. The Sierra Club needs them and more men of their caliber.
