

Dear Mr. Lujan:

Again I urge you to support the movement to impeach President Nixon. Despite his surrendering to Judge Sirica the nine tapes sought by Cox, he possesses other tapes and memoranda that could implicate the White House in wrong doing, and these he indicates he will not under any circumstances give up. The President's recalcitrance amounts to obstruction of justice — an impeachable offense in itself — which added to other misdemeanors, to wit: the Huston plan that gave birth to the "Plumber" and their nefarious operations, the perversion of the FBI, the CIA, and the IRS, the acceptance of large campaign contributions as bribes for valuable administrative considerations, and the illegal secret bombing of Cambodia, are more than sufficient grounds for removing the President from office.

You as a Republican bear especial responsibility for the re-establishment of confidence in the Government, which has been undermined by corruption at the highest levels of the Administration. A return to honest government requires first of all that this incubus be extirpated from the body politic. Most people expect of government officials, whether appointed or elected, impeccable ethical behavior and will not long tolerate influence peddling and self-serving favoritism which are all too prevalent today.
