Dear Mr. Grover:

As you suggest over the telephone I am sending you two rolls of Kodachrome 25 which I purchased last fall from Willoughby-Peerless. According to my experience with this film, both last summer in Maine and this last winter in Antarctica its speed rating should be ASA 50.

The three slides illustrate this conclusion:

- 1) Kodachrome 25 purchased in the summer of 1974
exposed in Maine in July of Osprey ASA 25
- 2) Kodachrome 25 purchased in the fall of 1974
exposed in Antarctica in January 1975 Roll 21, No. 25, ASA 50
- 3) Kodachrome 25 purchased in the fall of 1974
exposed in Antarctica in ~~XXXXXXX~~ January 1975
Roll 18, No. 28, ASA 50

On the basis of example #1 which strikes me as being over exposed I then used the higher speed rating for subsequent exposures in Antarctica and I feel the results confirmed this decision.

As far as subject matter goes these slides are of poor quality.

I shall be interested in your evaluation.
