Thanks for your letter. There is certainly no hurry and besides I have a feeling that Brower is not going to like the approach. But to speak more frankly than I did before, I definitely dislike the sort of prose poems that (for your private ear) Miss Newhall did- and I'm afraid that Brower has something of this sort in mind. This kind of rhapsody become fatally easy and all too often pretentious and false. As I said, I am not sure that the sort of factual material I suggested is really relevant. Maybe it is a little like accompanying Whistlers "other witha few biographical details on the old lady. But at least it is genuine and without attempting to add anything to the picture where nothing is necessary) supplies a sort of prose footnote. " IN WildNess
