Subject: Campaign Update

The \$350,000 Birds of Prey Natural Area, Snake River, Idaho fundraising campaign is evolving slowly but gradually building tremendous momentum. I am guilty of having underestimated campaign start-up time, and, with the exception of a few individuals, we have not yet begun asking people for contributions. The pre-campaign planning stage is critical, however, and nearing completion. It is doubtful that our year end \$150,000 goal will be met (approximately \$1500 has been received to date - spontaneously from individuals in response to press releases) but we anticipate being able to exercise the December 31, 1977 option as hoped.

- B. Large Contributor Proposal (12+ pages, 8½ x 11 spiral bound proposal with photos from July issue of Audubon).
 - Expected to be complete December 31, 1977. Print 50 costs about \$3 each.
- C. We have on hand 1000 copies of July Audubon and Defenders of Wildlife is reprinting their article for us.

B. Personal visits: selective appeal. Estimated 70-90% of campaign goal. 10-20% of contributors

This list will include carefully selected individuals, foundations, corporations and organizations. Because of the nature of the project, I am guessing 90% of these will be individual rather than institutional donors. With the assistance of members of the Committee I have assembled a

preliminary list of approximately 30 donors in this category.

This is the single most important way in which Committee members can help at this time. We need names, addresses and phone numbers as well as suggestions for the best approach when possible (Committee member?, Conservancy Board?, staff?, timing?, low key?, memorial?, etc.)
