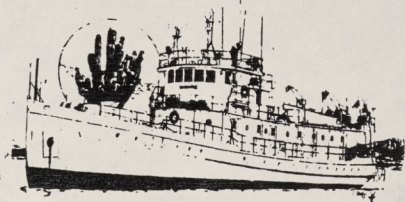

A BRIEF LOOK AT HER HISTORY ...

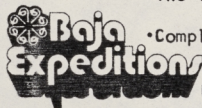
The boat, a 120' Hansen design for oceanographic research, was constructed in the Bainbridge Island shipyard in Seattle in 1934 for the U.S. government Department of Fish and Games. Christened the BROWN BEAR, she carried out marine research and policed the fishing activities around the Aleutian Islands of Alaska for 25 years.

After retiring from Alaska, she returned to Seattle where her laboratory facilities made a welcome addition to the marine biology department of the University of Washington.

Eventually she was sold, renamed the BAJA EXPLORADOR and taken to Ensenada, Baja California for two years of reconstruction and cosmetic work. She's now a comfortable cruising vessel used for wilderness group travel in the Sea of Cortez.

- 10 staterooms to accommodate 23 passengers, all with outside portholes
- 3 heads and 2 showers with hot and cold fresh water
- Renovated galley and dining salon with seating for the entire group.
- Scuba tanks and weightbelts for 20 divers
- Ingersoll-Rand compressor for 4 minute fills
- Individual dive lockers
- Fresh water wash for scuba and camera gear
- Snorkeling and fishing gear
- Two 18' skiffs with 40 hp outboards and three 13' Boston Whalers
- Complete library of natural history and Baja books

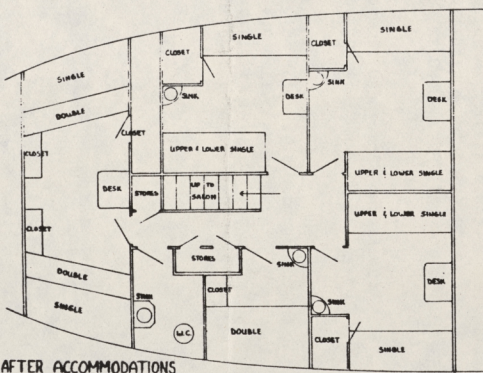
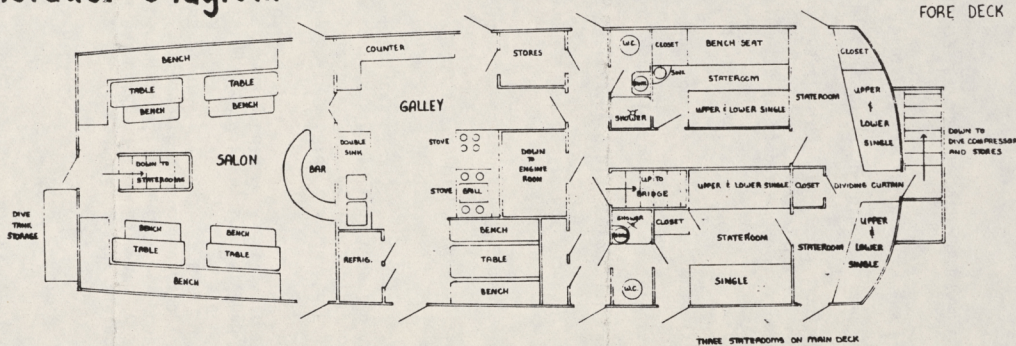

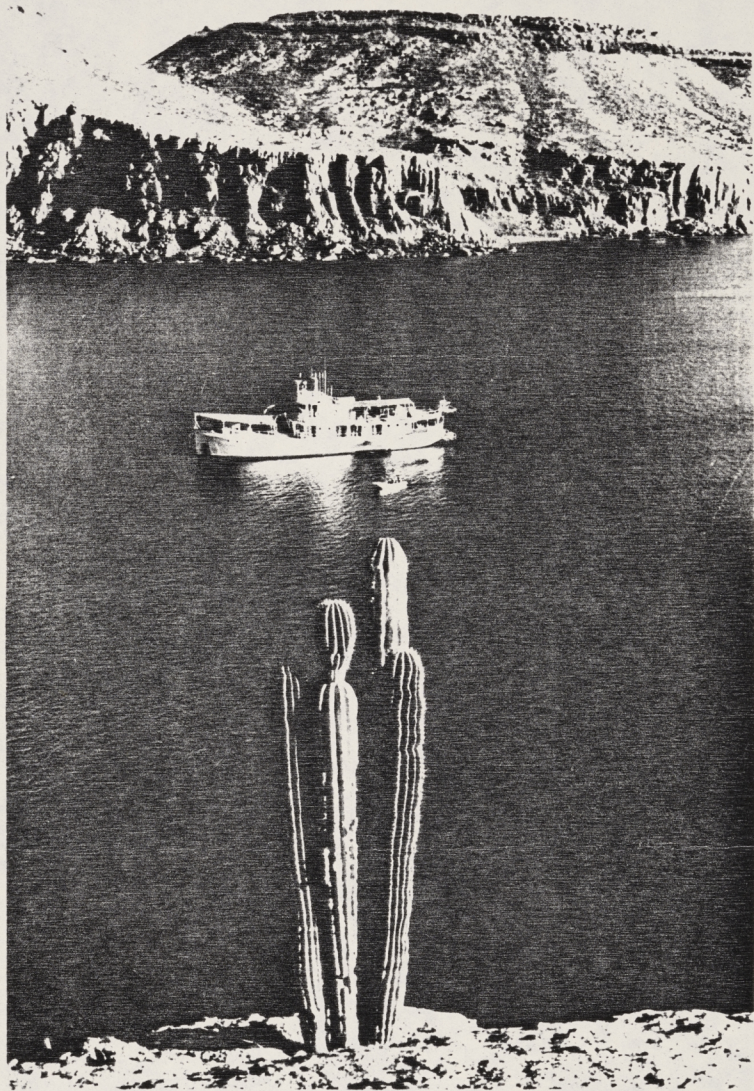
